Highlight species

Endemic & endangered Black-cheeked Ant-Tanager, also see regional endemics like Fiery-throated Hummingbird, Yellow-billed Cotinga, Spot-crowned Euphonia, Volcano Junco, Dark Pewee, Baird's Trogon, Orange-collared Manakin, Long-tailed Silky-Flycatcher, Fiery-billed Aracari, Golden-naped Woodpecker, etc.
